HAMLETS

The monthly Parish Council meeting was held on Wednesday 16th March 2022 in the Community Centre. Present were Cllrs. J Hobbs (Chair), K Boundy, J Phipps, R Savage, N Steer, S Tilbey, G Worden & K Jones, three members of the public and S Rosser (Clerk).

County Cllr. Tilbey outlined recent news from Cornwall Council. Cornwall Council are looking at ways of providing housing to Ukrainian refugees - if it can be possible. Consideration is being made on a 'Mayor for Cornwall' which could bring beneficial funding to the County.

Platinum Jubilee Celebration plans are still under way. Events will run over Thursday 2nd June – Saturday 4th June. Oak trees will soon be planted in each Hamlet. Red, white and blue wild flower seed mixes have been distributed for sewing on verges. Mugs will be purchased for children in the parish aged 0 - 16. Please get in contact with the Councillor Phipps to register your child for their mug – please find details on page xx. Deadline for registration is 30th April.

Three expressions of interest have now been received for the vacancy for a co-opted Parish Councillor. No more expressions can be accepted now.

The National Trust wish to re-open the toilets at Duckpool this year. Please see the advertisement on page xx if you wish to tender for the cleaning vacancy. Existing contracts were extended by 12 months, for the current arrangements of parish maintenance of footpaths/grass cuttings and the toilets at the hall. This follows a review of the Councils financial regulations - tenders will be publicised in the Autumn. A review was also taken of the general privacy notice, parish assets and the effectiveness of internal controls.

There were 14 items of correspondence noted. The Council consulted on the 'Tamara Project', this aims to connect the North to the South coast along the Devon/Cornwall border. This was supported.

One planning application was received for comment since the last full council meeting in February 2022. PA22/01371 - Construction of a shed at Darwood, Shop, Morwenstow, Bude, Cornwall, EX23 9SL - the Council supported the application.

The next regular Parish Council meeting will be held on Wednesday 20th April 2022.

PLEASE NOTE

From 18th April 2022 we will no longer be collecting crisp packets at Furze Stores.

Terracycle & Walkers have decided to close this scheme because supermarket collections of soft plastic packaging have become more successful and they no longer want to finance the smaller collectors!!! I have to send off my last consignment to Terracycle by 25th April 2022. We will receive a % the funding we started collecting until the end of 2022 so please don't forget to hand in your collection to Furze Stores by the 18th April.

It seems a shame as the recycling of the packets was gradually growing as people got into the habit of recycling the packets & fundraising for St. Marks School PTA. Please check the link below for your nearest collection point for crisp packets so you can continue to recycle them and they don't go to landfill instead.

The nearest collection point to Morwenstow is the Co-Op in Kilkhampton.

PLEASE NOTE

We are still collecting confectionery, cake, sweet biscuits, savoury biscuits and cheese soft plastic packaging and we will continue raising funds for St Marks this way until potentially they close these schemes in the future. Terracycle have already made the confectionery scheme more difficult as the total weight required for each consignment recently changed from 8kg to 12kg. That's a lot of sweet wrappers! So please keep collecting.

Pete Myers will be contacting the residents of Woolley to help us recycle soft plastic packaging raising funds for St Marks.

Many thanks to all the recyclers for your help and well done for getting in to the habit of recycling.
