HAMLETS

The monthly meeting of the Parish Council was held on Wednesday 19th October 2022; in the Community Centre at 7:30pm. Present were Cllrs. J Hobbs (Chair), J Phipps (Vice-Chair), R Savage, J Payne, N Steer, G Worden, S Tilbey, C Myers and S Rosser (Clerk). Cllrs. K Boundy & K Jones sent apologies.

County Councillor Tilbeys report covered the recent Bude Area Community Network Meeting. This included a presentation from Cornwall Council on the importance of 'Emergency Plans'. Along with a report from Inspector Dan Harvey of Devon & Cornwall Police who attended the meeting; and news that the County Councillors will be working alongside Budehaven Community School for their career's events.

As usual many items of Parish matters & maintenance discussed such as: Progress to Parish hedge maintenance by owners. Gooseham Green and parking on Crosstown Green. It was resolved to repair the noticeboards over the course of the next three years, on a need assessed basis - as per recommendation of Cllr. Steer. An anomaly of the Goosham bus route had been identified by Parishioners and rectified by Cllr. Worden. The Arbour for Crosstown has been delivered and will be positioned shortly. The Freeman of the Parish was also discussed with 5 nominations made. A presentation will be made in due course.

The inaugural meeting for the MUGA pitch (Multi Use Games Area) took place before the meeting. It was a positive meeting where by the proposal was supported. The survey will be circulated again for further responses. There is a link to this on the Parish website and the Morwenstow Facebook group. Please complete this if you have not done so already. However, concerns are raised that this could become a residential unit; therefore, request the inclusion of a condition to ensure that the building is ancillary to the main dwelling house.
