Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II – 1926 – 2022

Morwenstow Parish Council had much protocol to follow after the sad passing of our Queen. This was carried out by way of: our Union Flag flying at half mast during the period of mourning, and at full mast during the Proclamation of King Charles III. A local level Proclamation was read by our Chairman Cllr. J Hobbs at the Church of St Morwenna & St John the Baptist; on Sunday 11th September, this was followed by a verse of 'God save the King' with the bells being rung after. There was a National Moment of Reflection on Sunday 18th September at the Community Centre. Both events were attended by a good number of parishioners. A Book of Condolence was available in the Church - up until the day after the state funeral. A total of 124 messages were received spanning far and wide, from as far as Australia, Switzerland & Germany. The book will become part of a national book of condolence.

Due to the mourning period, the usual monthly meeting could not take place. Therefore, an extraordinary meeting of the Parish Council was held on Wednesday 28th September 2022; in the Community Centre at 7:30pm. Present were Cllrs. J Hobbs (Chair), J Phipps (Vice-Chair), K Boundy, J Payne, N Steer, G Worden, S Tilbey, K Jones & C Myers and S Rosser (Clerk). Cllr. R Savage sent apologies.

County Councillor Tilbeys report covered the recent Devon & Cornwall Police and Crime Commissioner appointment of the Chief Constable. He will be in post as of the New Year. Attendance of the Bude Rotary Club walk and the Holsworthy Rural Transport meeting.

There were many items of Parish matters & maintenance discussed such as: hedges/verges, footpath provision – a positive meeting was had with Oliver Jones of Cornwall Highways; actions to come from this in due course. Gooseham Green and parking on Crosstown Green were discussed. Noticeboard repair costs – advice had been received to proceed in a slightly different manner than first thought. There are approximately 20 Jubilee mugs left available for sale. The Arbour for Crosstown is due to be delivered soon. Tenders will be requested for the usual parish maintenance to aid the precept setting in November.

Results of the recent survey for a MUGA (Multi Use Games Area) were discussed. Almost 100 participants responded to this survey. Agreement was made to take the project forward. A further meeting will take place with any interested parties, on Wednesday 19th October at 7pm. This meeting will be followed by the monthly parish council meeting.

Finances were agreed for payment and the budget reviewed – this is on track. Discussion and decision took place around the admin facilities for the Clerk. A new laptop will be required as the support for the operating system on the current one, will end in January 2023, price to be obtained. A purchase of the 13th edition Local Council Administration was also agreed on its release in November.

Seven planning applications were received for comment since the planning meeting in August 2022. Councillors with interests left the room & took no part in the respective discussions.

If it is to be approved, Morwenstow Parish Council request that parking is provided within the site for the cars that will lose their spaces, as no other appropriate or available land lies within the settlement.
